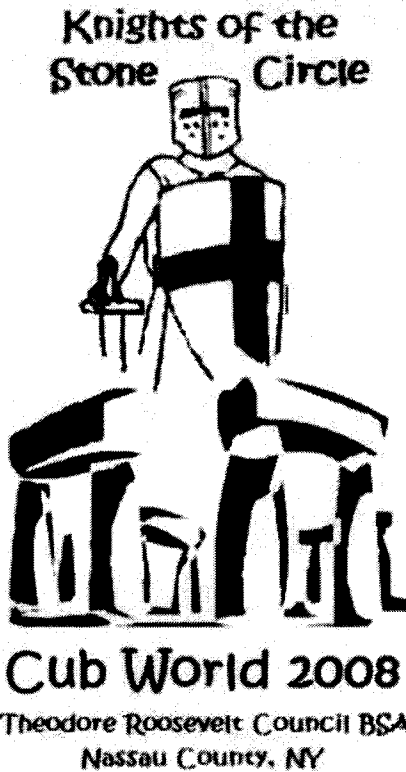

Come and spend the weekend with more than 600 other Scouts and Scouter's from all over the Theodore Roosevelt Council. The cost is \$18.00 per person and registration forms and fees need to be turned in to the Theodore Roosevelt Council Service Center in Massapequa. A health history form is required for each Scout and accompanying adult.

All participants will need to bring their own ~~pack~~ supplied tents. Tent sites will be assigned by the WEBELOS Woods Chairperson. Reservations must be accompanied by a registration form and full payment. Faxes will be accepted with a credit card. No telephone reservations will be taken.

The Concept and Purpose

WEBELOS Woods is an outdoor program activity designed to aid in the WEBELOS to Scout transition plan. The purpose is to help form a desire to know more about Boy Scouting and give WEBELOS a preview of the thrills of Boy Scouting.

WEBELOS Woods gives Scouts an opportunity to take a step up from Cub Scouting by camping as a Boy Scout camp does. The weekend is designed as a Patrol activity, much like a Boy Scout Camporee. The boys and adults will be participating in archery, first aid training, knot tying and games, religious services, campfire program and more.

Although the structure is different from Cub-parent weekend campouts, BSA camp safety regulations still **require an adult to accompany each Bear and/or WEBELOS Scout.**

The Schedule

Boy Scouts will begin site preparation Friday night to be ready for the WEBELOS Saturday's program. Friday, between 5:00 PM and 9:00 PM is scheduled for Troop sign in and camp setup. The flag ceremony will open the events on Saturday morning at 8:45 AM at the flagpole near Hickox Dining Hall. Between 9:00 AM - 4:00 PM WEBELOS will rotate to Scout skill hands-on activities. After dinner, religious services begin at 7:00 PM. Please remember a scout is reverent and attend your service. The camp-wide campfires will start on Saturday night at dusk, approximately 8:00 PM with Troop and patrol skits. Scouts (and adults) will want to get a good night's sleep because WEBELOS patrols will start preparing breakfast at 7:00 AM Sunday. Closing ceremonies will begin at 9:15 AM.

What to Bring?

WEBELOS and their parent are advised to bring their Scouting Spirit!, as well as their tent, sleeping bags or bedding supplies, a towel, basic toiletry articles, water in a jug or thermos, a warm jacket and gloves, insect repellent, a flashlight, rain gear, as well as comfortable clothes, a hat, sturdy shoes and socks. The Class "A" WEBELOS uniform is to be worn at all opening and closing ceremonies and religious services.

Remember, that May weather can be unpredictable and you should prepare your Troop for a rainy weather camping experience. For more information call the council service center at 516-797-7600. Please note that you may be sharing accommodations (tent sites) with other units so that we can serve more Scouts.

Do **NOT** bring firearms, sheathed knives, axes, hatchets, archery equipment, alcoholic beverages, glass containers, fireworks or pets.

Food - *cooking supplies + Food will be supplied by Pack...*

Each WEBELOS Troop will furnish their own food, as well as equipment for preparing their meals. Dishes and other washing **must** be done in the campsite. **Lyons Bathroom sinks are for hand washing only.** Stoves and lanterns using propane fuel may be used with adult supervision. The use of Coleman fuel, white gas, gasoline, or charcoal lighter fluid is **prohibited** due to the hazard involved. **Only propane or self-starting charcoal may be used. NO liquid fuel allowed!**

Fires

Campsites are assigned to assure complete use of campsite space. Fire rings are shared, which can be a fun way to meet people. Fires can only be built in the established fire rings, no ground fires outside the fire rings. Do **NOT** move the fire rings. Do **NOT** build new fire rings. Do **NOT** leave fires unattended; when extinguished, it must be cold to touch. Do **NOT** dig holes for fires or grease pits. **Each Troop provides its own fire protection.**

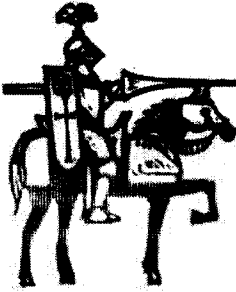
Leadership

WEBELOS must be under adult supervision at all times. The welfare of the individual Scout is the direct responsibility of the adult leaders. It is the leader's responsibility to control the actions of his troop, and organize free time activities for the boys. All Scouts and adult leaders must be registered with the Theodore Roosevelt Council. Be friendly, courteous, patient, helpful, and considerate to the boys, parents, and staff members. The area you occupy is your "Camp Home" for the weekend. Troop and patrol *Leaders should participate with their boys in camp activities, such as openings, closings, religious ceremonies, campfire, and special events.*

Please bring found items to the Hickox Dining Hall. Pick up lost items at the dining hall. Any items left behind will be brought to the council service center in Massapequa.

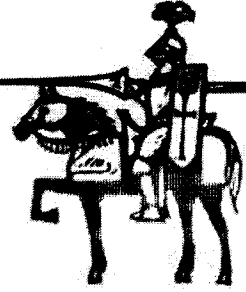

- * ❖ Spirit Award-All WEBELOS and adults should wear costumes to fit the Knights of the Stone Circle theme. Each patrol should pick a character theme to show their patrol spirit...
- * ❖ Saturday night campfire program-Each patrol should be ready with a Cub Scout BSA approved skit.
- ❖ Complete some of the requirements for the Readyman and Whittling Chip Activity Pin.
- * ❖ Catapult/Trebuchet Contest-Build and bring out to camp. Catapult/Trebuchets are to be no taller than four (4) feet in height
- * ❖ COOKING CONTEST – food must be made during WEBELOS Woods. WEBELOS Scouts must be able to explain recipe to the judges. WEBELOS must taste the food prior to the judges tasting it. The three top recipes will be printed in the council's newspaper *The Charger!*
- ❖ There will be a participation award (patch) for WEBELOS Scouts and adult who attend the weekend.
- ❖ Remember to bring your Class 1 medical form for the weekend. You can call the council service center for one or download from www.trcbsa.org

>>>>>>>>Camp Rules<<<<<<<<<

1. ALL units MUST CHECK-IN with the registrar upon arrival where you will receive information concerning areas available for camping.
2. Obey speed limits. At this event the speed is *10 mph*.
3. ALL vehicles must be parked in parking space for safe emergency evacuation and must remain in DESIGNATED parking areas during the weekend program.
Roads must be kept clear for emergency vehicles.
4. If you need to leave the campgrounds for any reason you must notify the registrar first.
5. This is a tent camping weekend. No RV's, campers or tent trailers.
6. No younger siblings are allowed in camp for program participation or the overnight stay.
7. No electronics such as video games, CD, mp3 or tape players, laser pointers, radios [non-communications], etc. Enjoy nature and let others enjoy it too.
8. ALL fires will be in established fire circles only and must be attended and thoroughly extinguished before leaving camp.
9. No brush gathering or timber cutting will be allowed.
10. All units MUST have their campsites inspected prior to check out by the service troop before leaving.
11. Deposit all camp garbage at the dumpsters located by Hickox Dining Hall and near the camp office in regular garbage bags and tie off the openings.
12. **No dishwashing in outdoor pumps or spigots. Gray water, no food or garbage, may be disposed in spigot drains.**
13. All off-limit areas will be designated with yellow caution tape or indicated in some other matter either physically or verbally.
14. NO ONE is allowed in or near Deep Pond. ANYONE in the lake will be escorted from camp and will not be allowed to return. NO REFUNDS!
15. ALL ACCIDENTS AND INJURIES MUST BE REPORTED TO THE FIRST AID STATION AND/OR RANGER IMMEDIATELY!
16. ALL spare propane tanks must be stored and locked in your vehicles. National Policy on the use of fuels must be followed.
17. As stated in the BSA Guidelines, youth may not use tobacco in any form. Adult smoking must be done away from all participants. All evidence must be removed by the adult and kept off of camp grounds. Scouting is a smoke-free environment.
18. NO FIREARMS [including pellet, bb and paintball guns] or FIREWORKS of any type are allowed in camp.
19. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE ALLOWED AT BSA EVENTS!
20. ABSOLUTELY NO PETS ARE ALLOWED!
21. Please Be Courteous. Don't cut through other people's campsites and stay on designated trails. NO SHORTCUTS!
22. "Do A Good Turn" by doing a service for the camp. For example, pick up garbage that you may see.
23. Scouts must use the buddy system while in camp when not accompanied by the guardian.
24. No Smoking in the vicinity of any youth or inside of any structure is allowed.

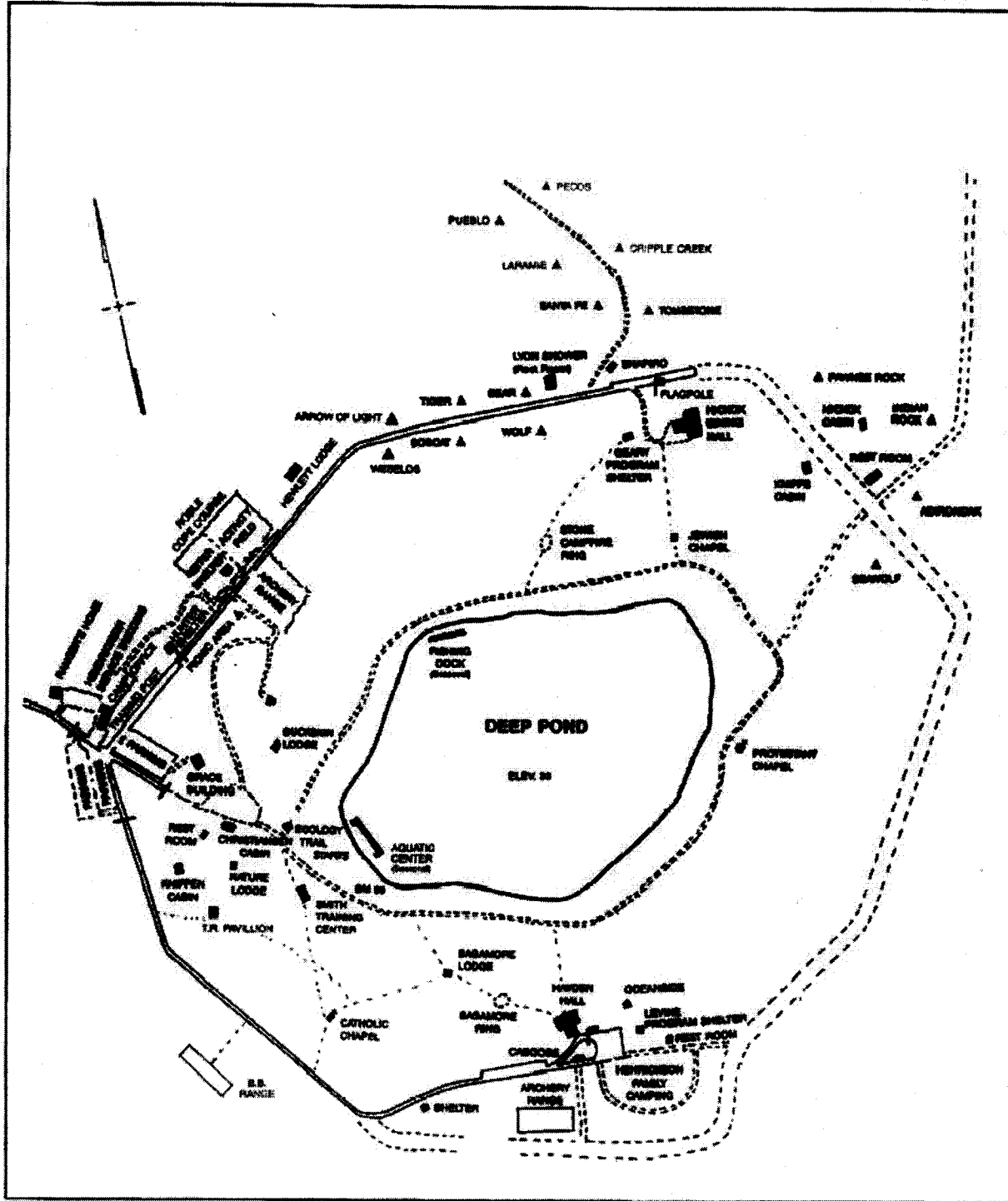
